

# PHOTOSHOP USING A TEXTURED ART BORDER

Having created a Textured Art Border from the previous worksheet – follow these instructions to apply it to an image:

1. Open the **Textured Art Border** and also the image it is to be applied to. If necessary, rotate the border so it is the same way round as the image.
2. With the **Move Tool** drag the image into the **Textured Art Border**.
3. Using Free Transform, **Ctrl + T**, resize the image so it is very slightly larger than the black area of the border – remember to hold down the **Shift** key as well to keep the image in proportion. When happy press **Return**.
4. In the **Layers Pallet** there will be two layers; **Layer 1** and the **Background**. Unlock the **Background** by right clicking on it and choose the option **Layer From Background** – click **OK**. Change the **Blending Mode** of this layer to **Screen**.
5. Drag **Layer 1** below **Layer 0** (previously the Background). The image will now be visible. Finally reposition this as necessary using the **Move Tool**. It is good practice to rename **Layer 1** as **Image** and **Layer 0** as **Texture Border**.

## Hint

If a black border is required (better for projection), simply invert the **Texture Border** layer by going to **Image > Adjustment > Invert** and change the **Blending Mode** to **Multiply**.
